Zaida has been an accountant for over a decade. She used to spend a large portion of her week sorting documents, rechecking numbers, and replying to extremely long email chains.

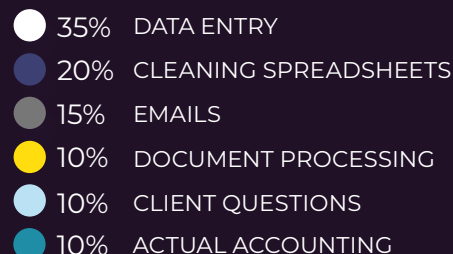
Then she began introducing AI into her routine. Now she uses Excel AI to clean data, QuickBooks AI to categorize transactions, and ChatGPT to help draft client emails. She says her work feels more mZaidageable, less repetitive, and far less stressful.

Zaida says the biggest surprise wasn’t the time she saved, it was how much calmer her workdays felt. Instead of starting her mornings buried under unread emails, she now uses AI to sort messages by urgency and draft quick replies. Her spreadsheets, once a maze of inconsistent formats, are now cleaned with a single prompt. And when clients ask for reports, she uses AI to summarize key insights so she can focus on explaining what truly matters. The shift hasn’t just made her faster... it’s made her more confident, organized, and present for her clients. ☰

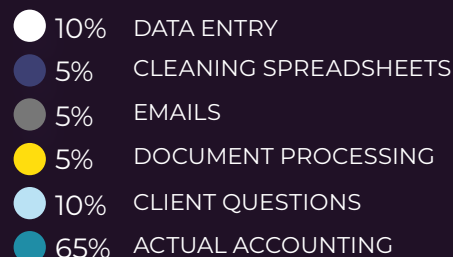

Let's be honest: accounting comes with a long list of repetitive tasks. Organizing receipts, fixing spreadsheets, answering messages, and double checking documents can easily take over the day. These small tasks add up, pulling attention away from deeper work that requires real expertise.

But now, a new type of assistant is helping accountants stay ahead: artificial intelligence, stepping in to simplify everyday tasks with speed and accuracy.

AI is not replacing accountants. Instead, it is taking over the routine work that slows us down. Today, AI can classify receipts, clean inconsistent spreadsheet text, summarize long documents, and detect unusual activity before it becomes a problem.

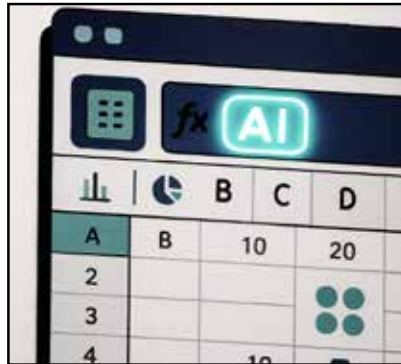

## IRS LAUNCHES A NEW AI CHATBOT

The IRS introduced a conversational chatbot for common tax questions. It won't replace an agent, but it does reduce wait times and improves basic support.

The new tool helps taxpayers with simple topics like payment plans and refund questions. It's still limited, but early users say it's faster than holding for an agent and makes basic IRS tasks much easier. ☰



## EXCEL ADDS AN AI FORMULA

Excel's new AI-powered formula builder can now explain complex formulas in plain language, making spreadsheets easier to understand. It highlights errors, and suggests cleaner replacements step-by-step.

The tool is especially useful for fixing broken worksheets, nested functions, or messy data. Even beginner users can troubleshoot confidently with clearer guidance. ☰

## ADOBE ACROBAT AI UPDATE

Adobe Acrobat's new AI update makes working with PDFs much easier. The tool can now extract tables, summarize long documents, and clean up messy text with one click.

# ASK THE AI

Great question, and one almost every accountant is asking right now. The good news is that starting with AI doesn't require major changes, new systems, or complicated training.

The easiest way to begin is by choosing one small task you already do each day and letting AI assist you with just that.

A simple first step is using AI to clean or format data. Excel's AI tools can fix dates, remove extra spaces, and explain unfamiliar formulas instantly.

This alone saves time and eliminates frustration. Another easy place to start is email: tools like ChatGPT and Outlook's AI suggestions can help you draft

messages or rewrite notes in a clear, professional tone. Once you feel comfortable, move to slightly bigger tasks, summarizing bank statements, turning long PDFs into short bullet points, or generating checklists from client requests.

These are small wins that build confidence quickly. The key is to start slow, stay curious, and use AI as a helper, not a replacement. Over time, these small steps add up, giving you smoother workflows, fewer repetitive tasks, and more time for real accounting work.

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
